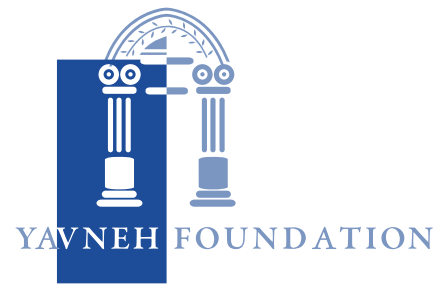

MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL Shula Lazar



As we come to the end of another successful year at Leibler Yavneh College, I extend my heartfelt thanks to all our friends and supporters for your incredible generosity. Your support has made a tangible impact on our school, not only by funding essential building refurbishments but also by enhancing the Jewish educational journey for every student.

One of the most meaningful and exciting initiatives we introduced this year was our inaugural ‘Yavneh x Flying Fox Camp.’ This program offered an all-inclusive camp experience, where Year 7 Yavneh students were partnered with equivalent age children at Flying Fox and, together, mentored and supported by Year 10 and 11 Yavneh students. It was the first program of its kind, and our students were thrilled to be a part of it. This opportunity to give and to grow would not have been possible without the generous support of the Zelwer Family and the Yavneh Foundation.

This year, thanks to your contributions, we have also been able to realize a significant part of our dream of moving the Kinder program to join all our other school students at the Elsternwick Campus. As a first step, with your support we’re moving our senior kindergarten students to our Nagle Avenue early in 2025. Now, our youngest students can fully experience being a part of the Yavneh family. They will have the privilege of learning and growing alongside older students, immersing themselves from the start in our vibrant community, and becoming part of the “big Yavneh” experience. This shift creates a unified environment that fosters stronger bonds, a sense of belonging, and an early connection to the values and spirit that is the Yavneh difference. Once the senior kinder students are settled in their new classrooms at Nagle Avenue, we will continue with our planning to move the junior kinder kids to join them in the future. I look forward to keeping you updated on these developments.

In *Parshat Vayeitzei*, we read about Yaakov’s journey away from his familiar surroundings, stepping into an unknown future. As he rests for the night, he dreams of a ladder reaching toward heaven, with angels ascending and descending, and he awakens to a profound realization:

מִה־נוֹרָא הַמָּקוֹם הַזֶּה אֵין זֶה כִּי אִם־בֵּית אֱלֹהִים וְזֶה שַׁעַר הַשָּׁמַיִם:

“How awesome is this place! This is none other than the abode of God, and that is the gateway to heaven.” (Bereishit 28:17)

Yaakov’s journey reminds us that our physical surroundings can hold deep spiritual significance and that a sacred space can inspire those within it to reach for higher ideals.

Your generosity helps us to create such a space for our students. The upgraded facilities and new learning environments directly impact their academic success, but even more importantly, the Yavneh environment fosters a love for Torah, a deep connection to Jewish identity, and an enduring commitment to *Medinat Yisrael*. With the addition of our senior kinder children to Elsternwick, we have now extended this nurturing environment, ensuring even more of our students grow into bnei and banot Torah who are not only knowledgeable about their heritage but also passionate about their role in the Jewish community and beyond.

This emphasises that supporting a child's education, particularly in Torah, is not just an act of charity but a fundamental contribution to the continuity and spiritual rebuilding of Jewish life.

FOUNDATION Events



Hasbara Series

The current climate for the Jewish people around the world following the atrocities committed on October 7th by Hamas, has left us with a sense of confusion, concern and isolation. Who could have possibly anticipated that the State of Israel could be caught off guard so drastically on that fateful *Simchat Torah*? And whilst we initially received the sympathy and support of many countries and individuals, their allegiance and affinity appear to be dwindling. Jews everywhere have been forced to consider questions that had not previously arisen. How could this happen? What is the historical context which has led to these events? What does it mean for the future of the Middle East, the State of Israel and the Jewish people?

As a school, we have endeavoured to wrestle with these questions every day since the war began. The daily *Kenes Tefillah*, where we bring the entire secondary school together to daven for the IDF, the hostages and everyone in Israel, helps ensure that we do not forget about the war amidst our everyday activities.

We have also been able to use this space as an opportunity to hear from people on the ground, as alumni and former *Shlichim* have sent in videos to help us get an understanding of what it is like to be in Israel at the moment. We provide regular updates about the situation at every assembly and have been privileged to hear from various heroes of the war who have visited Australia to share their stories. Each day our classes are dedicated to those in need of extra merit at this time.

Reflecting on all of this, the Yavneh Foundation board recognised the need to engage the wider Yavneh community in these topics. A three-part *Hasbara* (Israel Advocacy) Series was designed with two key aims. First to provide Yavneh families with a ‘window into the classroom’, thereby gaining an insight into the Israel education that our students receive and secondly, to provide attendees with fundamental knowledge to be able to understand the history of the Arab-Israeli conflict and become a more confident advocate for Israel.

Noah Epstein, Head of Jewish Life and Learning (secondary) delivered the first session, focussing on the origins of the conflict and key moments within it before the establishment of the State of Israel in 1948, whilst drawing parallels to themes in the current war. At the second session, Principal, Shula Lazar unpacked the central events from the 6 Day War in 1967 until the Gaza withdrawal in 2005 and identified the impact that these years had on Israel’s political landscape. Rav Noam Sender presented the final session, honing in on October 7th and what the next chapter may look like for Israel and the Jewish people, helping us to make sense of current trends in global antisemitism and providing hope for a better future.

The Jewish people have a renewed level of responsibility to know our history and be able to defend ourselves on social media, university campuses and wherever else we may be challenged. We thank the presenters for their informative and engaging sessions and everyone who joined us for this important series.

Welcoming The Honourable Josh Frydenberg

The Yavneh Foundation was thrilled to welcome a full audience at our event with The Honourable Josh Frydenberg, Former Treasurer of Australia.

Foundation Members enjoyed a special opportunity to meet and mingle with Mr Frydenberg before the formal program began. To open the evening, our College Captains recited *Tehillim* and *Tefillot* for the hostages and our Chayalim, as has become tradition at all Yavneh events since October 7. We thank the *Chazzan* of Mizrahi, Isser Feiglin for leading us in heartfelt *Tefillot* as everyone joined together to pray for peace and security for *Am Yisrael*.

We extend our gratitude to Joel Burnie, Executive Manager of AIJAC (and current Yavneh parent) for facilitating an engaging conversation with Mr Frydenberg and posing thought-provoking questions that allowed us to reflect deeply on his documentary, "Never Again: The Fight Against Antisemitism". Mr Frydenberg's powerful advocacy for Israel and the Jewish community serves as a tremendous example of the positive impact of strong leadership during this difficult time for our community in Australia and around the world.

Mr Frydenberg shared poignant personal encounters from his recent visit to Israel post-October 7 and offered invaluable insights into the complexities of combatting antisemitism. He reiterated the importance of education and leadership within our Yavneh community, inspiring us all with his dedication and articulate advocacy for Israel and the Jewish people. His leadership serves as a beacon of hope and resilience for all of us. We thank Mr Frydenberg for joining us at Yavneh and for being a strong and powerful voice of our people.

Eylon’s message to our Yavneh students was clear: stand up for who you are and never let others make you feel ashamed of your identity.

Our Principal, Shula Lazar, shared the exciting project that the event will help fund: upgrading projectors and whiteboards in our secondary classrooms. This new technology will enhance classroom engagement, allowing teachers to integrate modern tools with timeless teaching methods.
